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Activity outline - Amlinell gweithgaredd

Works of art can be completed either on an individual canvas or as a whole group, large-scale project.

- Explore / fforio the outdoors and collect resources
 - Remember to follow all safety procedures and safeguarding processes
- Encourage children to look around for fallen leaves and twigs, flowers, feathers, shells, stones etc.
- Provide the children with a blank, square, individual canvas or framed space on the concrete floor and secure with tape
- Leave the resources for the children to explore and create
 - Remember to discuss why it is important to choose items that have fallen on the ground rather than pulling them from trees etc.
- Encourage children to photograph their finished pieces of art.

Extension – Develop a floor book using the printed photographs of children's artwork or use a digital photo frame to view the children's artwork and promote discussion.
