## **Key Activity 2: The learning walk**

The learning walk is an addition to the inspection day divities. Previously, providers or their representative would give the inspector a tour of their setting. This was mainly a felp the inspector find their way around the setting three out to day. ### B fore the learning walk

As man ser and leader, it is completely normal to feel examely nervous about the learning walk, especially as it usua / happens very early on in the inspection day. You may still feel anxious and be running on adrenaline. There are some key

ways that you can prepare for your learning walk to reduce you stress on the day.

- Plan the route that you will take with t'e insrector.
  Focus on all areas of the setting not just the rooms where the children are based
- Practice your learning walk by taking a walk are and your setting. Think carefully about what you want to say and make notes on your intention for contact and their families in each area of your etting
- The learning walk should liter "ly be a walking evaluation of your setting's environment, present and successes
- Try to relax. The insportor is not trying to catch you out they just want to good feel for you and your setting.
