# **Activity: Dots of fun on International Dot Day**

Celebrate children's creativity and uniqueness on International Dot Day, a day which emphasises the power of making your mark.

### **Learning aims**

- Encourage creativity and self-expression
- Fine and gross motor skills
- Shape recognition concept of dots as shapes.

#### **Resources**

- Paper or fabric (could be small pieces for individual children or one large piece for a group project)
- Paint, markers, crayons etc
- Paint brushes, sticks, cotton buds etc.
- Circle shaped stamps made from sponges, potatoes etc
- Natural items such as leaves, pinecones
- Playdough or clay
- A copy of The Dot by Peter H. Reynolds (optional).

## **Activity outline**

- 1. Explain International Dot Day to the children as an opportunity to celebrate everybody's creativity and inner artist. Even a simple dot on a page, made by you, with the resources you choose will be different from anyone else's dot. The dot you create will be as unique and special as you
- 2. If available, read The Dot by Peter H. Reynolds, which inspired Dot Day
- 3. Provide a wide variety of resources for children to make a dot, multiple dots, or a collage of dots (see resource section above for some ideas). Children may have their own ideas about what they'd like to use
- 4. Let the children create their own pieces of art remember one unique dot is enough
- 5. Create an art gallery to display the finished work for everyone to see and enjoy.

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#### **Extension ideas:**

- Go on a nature walk and ask the children to find dot shapes in nature. Take photos and make a dotty nature book
- Learn and sing <u>The Dot</u> song together (by Emily Arrow and Peter H. Reynolds)
