Funded Early Years Places - Further guidance on additional charges permitted/not permitted

Permitted

Items that are consumed or have a one-time use and therefore must be replaced can be charged for.

If a parent does not want to pay for these 'extras' the provider should be able to provide options for alternatives to additional charges, e.g. bring packed lunch, alternative sessions where meals not included.

Uniforms can be charged for but wearing a uniform must not be a condition of the child attending and accessing their funded place.

If the activity is not specifically part of the EYFS, travel costs and other reasonable charges associated with the trip can be charged to parents.

Parents must have the option of their child attending or not. Consider what effect not attending may have on children whose parents opt to not take part in the trip.

Not Permitted



- Large consumables are durable items used repeatedly and do not need to be purchased every time they are used.
- Utilities are business cost and cannot be charged for as an additional
- Play Equipment, Learning Resources, Craft Materials & Staff Training are a requirement of delivering the EYFS and therefore a business cost.
- Other business & EYFS costs: Stationery, computer software, online journals/tracking system & admin fees.
- · Health and Safety equipment is a requirement under Health and Safety legislation.
- Care items are essential items for providing care to young children.
- Top-up fees (the difference between a provider's usual fee and the funding they receive from the local authority to deliver funded places) or compulsory registration fee cannot be charged by the provider.
